Voting records can be a helpful overview, but are *just one part of the total picture* when reviewing legislative accomplishments. Some members may have gone above and beyond in their committee support and votes, or assisted in defeating legislation IACI opposed, neither of which are reflected in these voting records.



Key Election Dates

April 20: Last day to pre-register to vote with your County Clerk

May 9: Last day for an application for a mail-in absentee ballot to be received by County Clerk

May 11: Last day for in-person absentee voting until 5:00 p.m. for the Primary Election at the absent elector's polling place.

May 15: Last day to return absentee ballots to the County Clerk's Elections Office by 8:00 p.m. — Primary Election Day!
